Program Overview

The Dental Assistant (DA) program will prepare students to provide the services of a Certified Dental Assistant as outlined in the College of Dental Surgeons of British Columbia (CDSBC) Bylaws under the Health Professions Act of British Columbia. The outcomes and objectives upon which students will learn also include elements of dental assisting practice which are:

- Professional conduct
- Safe, ethical & professional practice
- Communication
- Collaborative practice/teamwork
- Problem solving & critical thinking
- Dental assisting process of care
- Provision of chair-side assisting skills & clinical treatment
- Provision of dental office administration skills
- Provision of dental laboratory skills
- Health promotion & education for individuals and communities

Career Opportunities

Upon successful completion of the DA program the student will be eligible for the National Dental Assistant Examining Board (NDAEB) written exam and clinical practice evaluation, and earning anywhere from \$24 to \$28 per hour.



PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Program Admission Requirements

Applicants will be required to meet the following minimum criteria:

Applicants Whose First Language is English

• High School Diploma or equivalent and proof of English Language Proficiency.

• For English Language proficiency, domestic students are required to have completed Grade 10 English or successfully completed the College's English language proficiency assessment.

Applicants whose First Language is not English:

International students will need to submit proof of English language proficiency by meeting one of the following requirements:

- Grade 12 graduation diploma in a school system in which English is the official language, or
- Successfully completed a pre-Intermediate certificate from a Language Canada-accredited school or
- Successfully completed Western Community College's English language proficiency assessment, or
- Successfully completed a 24-week ESL program at the College

Note: Completion of grade 12 Science (especially Biology and/or Physics) is advantageous.

 - influenza (required annually)

Basic Eligbility Requirements

To receive student financial assistance, you must meet all of these basic eligibility criteria:

- be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident or have protected person status
- have a valid Canadian social insurance number
- be a resident of British Columbia
- be pursuing full-time studies as your primary occupation
- be enrolled in an eligible program of study at an eligible post-secondary institution
- be able to demonstrate financial need

• make academic progress and achieve satisfactory scholastic standing in each period of postsecondary study

NOTE: All information submitted as part of your application package, including information provided by your parents or spouse/commonlaw partner in appendices, is subject to verification and audit.

NOTE: You can only apply to one province for funding

i) You may not eligible if you have:

- Delinquent or in default of previous student loans.
- Under audit or have an overaward (in this case your funding may be withheld), or
- Incarcerated or have any outstanding warrants for your arrest











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
