

## **Program Overview**

This program is designed to prepare the student with the skills and knowledge that they will require to become a pharmacy assistant. Students will become familiar with pharmacology, pharmacy math, and pharmacy billing software. They will be introduced to the basic bookkeeping and accounting principles, and will be able to understand computer applications and keyboarding.

### **Career Opportunities**

Graduates from this program can work as Pharmacy Assistant in various pharmacies and earn anywhere from 19.61\$ to 27.30\$ per hour. After completion of this program, the graduates will be able to work as:

- Pharmacy distribution companies
- Independant pharmacies
- Community Pharmacies
- Hospitals



# PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

# **Program Admission Requirements**

Applicants will be required to meet the following minimum criteria:

- The applicant must be a mature student (19 years or older) or Grade 12.
- Grade 10 Math or equivalent.

# **Program Duration**

The Pharmacy Assistant program is a 760 hours program, for a full time studit will take 38 weeks/7 months and for a part time student it will take 47.5 weeks/11 months to finish the program and obtain the diploma.







# LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

Language Proficiency Requirements To demonstrate language proficiency, applicants must meet at least one of the following criteria:

Option 1: Secondary Education Evidence that three years of full-time secondary education (Grades 8-12) have been successfully completed in English in a country where English is one of the principal languages. This includes successful completion of a BC Adult Graduation program.

Option 2: Post-Secondary Education Evidence that two years of full-time post-secondary education have been completed in the program's language of instruction at an accredited institution in a country where the language of instruction is one of the principal languages. Language development (ELL) courses cannot be included.

Option 3: Standardized Language Test Achievement of minimum scores on a recognized standardized language test:


